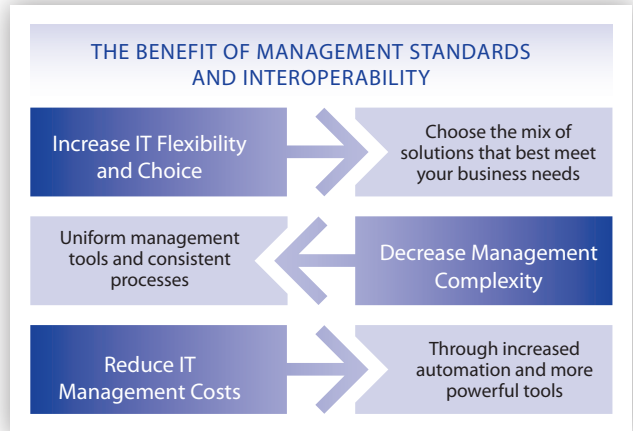


Developing Standards that Enable Interoperable IT Management
